

Next Week's Program: Chris Swan, CL&P

Today's Program: Our speaker today was Jennifer Herring, President and CEO of The Maritime Aquarium at Norwalk. The Aquarium, which is celebrating its Silver Anniversary, was founded in 1988 to be a fun and an educational resource for children and adults as well. Establishing the aquarium was made possible by a \$30 million dollar bonding by the Norwalk Redevelopment Agency and by the Norwalk Seaport Association. At the aquarium, visitors have the opportunity to observe all of the creatures of Long Island Sound in their natural habitat. Long Island Sound, which is an estuary, has the largest temperature gradient of any salt water body in the world. In addition to seals, fish, sharks, penguins, and many other wildlife creatures, the aquarium also has an IMAX theatre. Throughout the year over 500,000 people visit the aquarium and over 80,000 students go to the aquarium on field trips every year.
