with a way to plan for long term care “without fear or risk of becoming poor”. Owners of LTCI policies who also join the partnership, are able to protect a significantly larger amount of their assets from Medicaid. As the insured uses their insurance policy to pay for LTC services, the partnership members are able to protect a related amount of their financial assets at such a point in time that they must qualify for Medicaid coverage.
