

Program: Comstock

Parks and Rec. Director Steve Pierce spoke about the Comstock renovation, which came in significantly under budget. Comstock was built in 1955, with the east wing and senior center added in 1995. There has been lots of community interest in the redone center, which has, among other things, new lighting, a playground, and basketball courts. It also serves as the town shelter, with Wi-Fi, a/c, and heat all capable of being powered by its generator. Pierce also spoke about our synthetic athletic fields, put in more than 12 years ago and now due for replacement. Organic coconut husks will be used for the fields, replacing the previous crumb rubber. This material should be 30% cooler with no carcinogenic risks. The fields will sit on a Brock pad for drainage, and this is expected to reduce field-related concussions by 25% - a little too late for Paul B, but in time to save the brains of the next generation.
